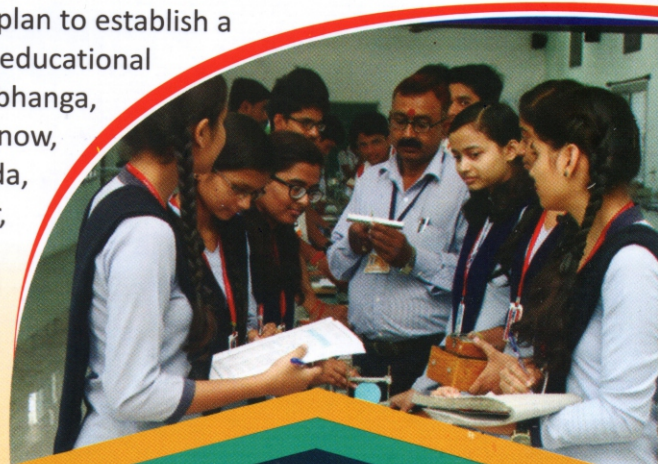
INTRODUCTION

Prior to 1962, the Kothari commission felt the need of such senior secondary schools in the country so as to follow common syllabus and pattern throughout India and to be affiliated to an All-India-Body, for the benefit of the children of Central Government employees as well as floating population of the country. These endeavors have been made in correct perspective.

In November 1964, on the basis of the report of the Kothari Commission, the Government of India, were pleased to open a number of senior secondary schools at various places of the country so as to render educational facilities to the children of such floating families.

In order to fulfil the demands throughout the country the Scholar's Education Trust of India in 1964, under the auspices of Central Academy Education Society, also discussed over the need of such senior secondary schools and decided to establish a series of schools in the country complementing the Govt. of India's programme for the benefit of general mass which was desirous of providing education to their children based on All India Syllabus.

Since then, the Central Academy Educational Society made a plan to establish a number of senior secondary schools and various other educational institutions at place like New Delhi, Hazaribagh, Motihar, Darbhanga, Patna, Munger, Ranchi, Jamshedpur, Ramgarh, Nainital, Lucknow, Mussoorie, Rampur, Bareilly, Bangalore, Ahmedabad, Baroda, Jodhpur, Surat, Jaipur, Kota, Suratgarh, Udaipur, Bikaner, Alwar, Srinagar, Chittorgarh, Ajmer, Bharatpur, Bhilwara, Rewa, Shahdol, Jabalpur, Bhilai, Deoria, Gorakhpur, Chhindwara, Itarsi, Balaghat, Gwalior, Allahbad, Barabanki and many other places in the country.

The school which run under the name of Central Academy, are composite, co-educational English Medium SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS having classes from Nursery to Senior Secondary (10+2) level and follow a common syllabus throughout the country. After opening and equipping the school, all the classes are made affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi under the All India Education scheme.

AIMS OF THE SCHOOL

COURSE AND AFFILIATION

It following the All India syllabus approved and prescribed by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, the leading of All India Secondary Examination Body. The Schools which are having classes from Nursery to XII (+2) are made affiliated to the CBSE under All India Education scheme.

SESSION : The school session starts from 1st April to 31st March every academic year.

ADMISSION TEST: The admission test will cover English, Hindi, Math & Science based on the syllabus of the preceding class to which admission is sought.



ENCLOSURES

The following enclosures should compulsorily be attached with the Registration Form. If any of these is not available, an application for extension must be made. In any case the required documents should be submitted within fifteen days of the admission.

2. Transfer Certificate from the school last attended.
3. Photostat copy of Progress Report (Prep. onwards) of the previous classes.
4. Aadhar Card of child

AGE LIMIT

A pupil seeking admission to Nursery Class must have attained the minimum age of 2½ years (3½ year in case of LKG) as on or before 1st April of the year in which admission is sought. A corresponding minimum age limit will be calculated for the succeeding classes.

FEE RULES

1. The fee will be collected upto 15th of every month; if 15th falls on a holiday, the next working day will be the last day for collecting the fee without imposing any late fee.
2. If the fee is not deposited till the 15th of month, late fee will be charged as per following slab-
 - Rs. 20/- from 16th to last day of the month.
 - Rs. 50/- After last day of the month.
3. Once fees deposited will not be refunded.
4. If a student seeks to leave school for whatever reason, the withdrawal notice, at least a month in advance, will have to be submitted, failing which he will be required to deposit one month's tuition fee & other relevant fees.
5. A student seeking admission during mid-session will have to pay all the general fee for the full academic year, examination for the remaining examinations, tuition fee for 12 month.
The fee for the month of May and June will have to be deposited in the month of December and January.
The admission fee will be charged in the month of April as the school session starts from 1st April to 31st March every academic year.

Printed syllabus in the form of a booklet is provided by the school separately for classes VI to XII. For classes Nursery to V syllabus is printed on student diary.

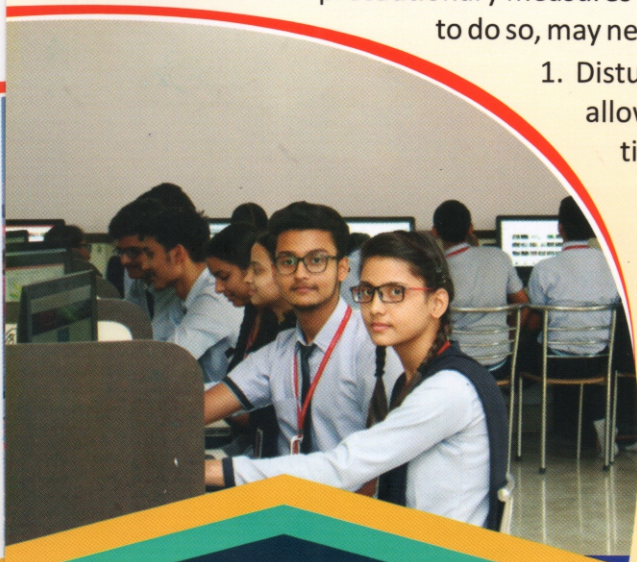
EDUCATIONAL TOURS AND ADVENTURES

A wide range of education tours catering to all age group is an integral part of education. These include trips to well-known gardens, zoological parks, picnic spots, museums, post offices, farmer houses etc. in and around the city, for children of lower classes. For higher classes, such tours also include various factories, some industrial units and cultural centres, and others. Outstation excursions are also organized for the students for spirit of inquiry, adventure, comradeship and nature ramble.

RULES & REGULATION FOR THE STUDENTS

To maintain strict discipline, to speed up progress and streamline efficiency, we are compelled to take certain precautionary measures in the institution and their compliance is compulsory. Any failure to do so, may necessitate disciplinary action without prior notice.

1. Disturbances like running, shouting etc. during class hours are not allowed in the school. Games & sports are to be played during the time fixed for it.
2. Students must respect all teachers and authorities. They must be courteous and polite under all circumstances.
3. Any damage to the school property or to the belonging of the staff or any other student will have to be compensated for.
4. Students must observe punctuality in arriving at school. A late-comer may not be allowed to enter the school or class. Continuous late-comers would be suspended.



5. All the students must come neatly dressed to the school. During regular checking any student found without proper uniform shall be punished.
6. Under no circumstances the school authorities will be held liable for indiscipline or misconduct on the part of any students outside the school premises.
7. The minimum compulsory attendance in class is as follows:

Nursery to V	-	70 percent
Std VI to VIII	-	80 percent
Std IX to XII	-	80 percent



- Student falling short of attendance, as prescribed above, will not be allowed to appear for the examination.
8. A student who has been absent on the previous day without leave application will not be permitted to the class unless permission is granted by the principal. One who remains - absent without leave application for 20 days will be expelled from the school. A student who remains absent due to illness for a considerable span of time must submit a medical certificate. Absence without leave application from parents will be penalized with a fine of Rs. 2 each day and all fines will be charged with monthly fee.
 9. Any mis-demeanour during the examination hall will amount to failure in subject &: will be dealt with stern disciplinary action.
 10. The student must bring their textbooks, notebooks and school diary regularly to the class.
 11. Parents/ Guardians are expected to help their wards in doing their home assignments &: check their school diary regularly.
 12. As the medium of instruction in the school is English, it is compulsory for the students to converse in English.
 13. No visitor will be allowed to contact any student without the prior permission of the office.
 14. The student will not be called from the class to attend any phone call unless it is very urgent.
 15. Participation in all school activities and function is compulsory and the school uniform is to be worn in such functions unless instructed otherwise.

STUDENT FACILITIES

1. A well-stacked library with internet facility is filled with variety of over 10,000 books on different subject. Apart from this various journals, Magazines, periodicals and encyclopedias are available for students from Std I to XII. In the Pre-primary &: Primary Classes, picture reading &: storytelling form a regular features of instruction.
2. Laboratory facilities are available for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science &: Maths.
3. The Computer Center provides an adequate number of computers to impart computer education from Std III onwards.
4. Audio-Visual equipments are also provided to be used as teaching aids and for screening educational &: socially relevant programmes for the children.
5. The school has a spacious playground for outdoor games like cricket, football, hockey, kho-kho, basketball etc and a big hall for indoor games like badminton, table tennis, carrom, chess etc.

MEDICAL FACILITIES

Regular Medical check-up of all the student is done in a year by expert and eminent physicians.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

SUMMER SEASON

For Boys: Light blue shirt in checks, Dark blue pant, White socks with blue line, black shoes with laces, Dark blue Tie and Dark blue belt with light blue line in middle.

For Girls: (Std. Nursery to VIII) Dark blue skirt with blue short, light blue shirt in checks, Black Ribbon and other as above.

For Girls: (Std. 9th to 12th) Light blue Kurta in checks with blue shorts, Dark blue Salwar and Dupatta, black ribbon and other as above.



WINTER SEASON

1. In addition to summer uniform dark blue pullover with V-shaped neck in light blue line and Dark blue blazer.
2. In winter, full pant will be compulsory for all boys for Nursery to XII.
3. Dark blue stacks for Girls from Nursery to XII.
4. Blazer will be compulsory for both boys and girls standard V to XII.



ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The curriculum from Nursery to Std XII includes the following core subject and the following activities.

NURSERY: To develop motivation towards study in school environment, an introduction to the capital letters of alphabets in English, Hindi & Numbers 1 to 20, colouring.

KINDERGARTEN: Children learn to write the cursive alphabets in English & Hindi, reading & writing of short words in both the languages, Number 1 to 100, drawing.

STD I to V: English, Hindi, Maths, Environment Studies, Computer, Music, General Knowledge, Value Education, Sanskrit (for V) SUPW, Drawing & Crafts.

STD VI to VII: English, Hindi, Sanskrit, General Science, Modern Mathematics, Social Studies, Crafts, Drawing & Painting, Music, General Knowledge, SUPW, Computer Science and Mental Mathematics.

STD IX & X: Compulsory subject: Hindi Course A, Communicative English, Mathematics, Science and technology and Social Science.

STD XI & XII (10+2) PATTERN: Science stream: Compulsory- English, Physics & Chemistry. Optional- Maths/Hindi, Biology/Physical Education (any two may be offered).

Commerce stream: Compulsory - English Core, Business Studies, Accountancy & Economics. Optional- Hindi /Physical Education/ Maths (anyone may be offered).

TEST & EXAMINATION: In each academic year the school will hold the following test and examinations.

1.Exam Schemes from classes I to VIII : The school will conduct two terminal examinations in the entire year from class I to VIII. Periodic Assessment-I and Half Yearly Examination will be included with Term-I (April-September) and Periodic Assessment-II and Annual Examination will be included with Term-II (October-March). Class assessment and Project activity will also be included with each term.



2. **Exam Schemes from classes XI and X :** For class-IX and X three periodic written tests will be conducted in the entire year and the average of best two will be taken for final mark submission.
3. **Pre-Board examination :** These examinations are conducted twice (Jan. & Feb.) for the students of classes X & XII. These examinations are based on complete syllabus of each subject. These examinations help the students to face the Board/annual examination as well as to understand the system of the Board examination.
4. **Board Examination :** It is started from first week of March every year for the students of class XII and class X. It is confirmed that periodic exams are not applicable for classes XI & XII. For these classes Quarterly in the month of August, Half yearly in the month of October and Annual examination in the month of Feb./March are conducted.
5. **Exam Scheme for Nursery L.K.G. & U.K.G. :** The school academic year is planned out from April to March and is divided into three terms. At the end of the each term there will be periodical assessment i.e. Quarterly, Half yearly and Annual examination.



PARENT-TEACHER MEET

In order to maintain continuous interaction between parents and teachers with the progress of the students, Parent-Teacher meet is held after every examination. We expect all parents to attend these meeting, as far as possible, so that a concerted effort can be made for the overall development of their wards. Beside this, parents can also meet the teachers on every second Saturday of the month.

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

It is obligatory on the part of every child to submit Transfer Certificate from the previous school at the time of admission. This does not apply for fresh admission in Nursery & LKG.

WITHDRAWALS

Notice of withdrawals must be given in written in one month in advance, failure to given such notice will entitle to pay one month's tuition and other fees if applicable.

The name of the withdrawal child will not be, re-enrolled after it had been struck off from the roll due to any reason.

EXAMINATION SCHEME

1. **The final assessment** of the pupil for promotion excluding the Examination held by the CBSE will be based on a maximum of 100 marks in each subject which is as under :

From class - Nursery to UKG

- Term I (Quarterly Exam) - 30%
- Term II (Half Yearly Exam) - 30%
- Term III (Annual Exam) - 40%

From class - I to VIII (Term-I)

- Periodic Assessment-I - 10%
- Note Book/Class Assessment - 5%
- Project activities - 5%
- Half Yearly Examination - 80%



(Term-II)

- Periodic Assessment-II - 10%
- Note Book/Class Assessment - 5%
- Project activities - 5%
- Annual Examination - 80%

From class - IX to X (A+B+C)

(A) – 10%

- Periodic Test - I - 40 marks
- Periodic Test - II - 60 marks
- Periodic Test - III - 80 marks

Only best two periodic will be taken for final mark submission.

(B) – 10%

- Note Book - 05 marks
- Project activities - 05 marks

(B) – 80%

- Annual Examination - 100 marks

2. Promotion Policy :

The Evaluation of Scholastic & Co-Scholastic Areas will be reflected for classes I to X only in the form of Grades/Grade Points.

3. To pass the Exam, a student must obtain the qualifying grade (minimum grade D) in all the subject under scholastic and co-scholastic Domain. In class IX & X, if a student obtains grade E in one or more subjects then he will be Eligible for improvement of Performance (EIOP) one time for class IX and X.

EIOP - is not allowed for the students of lower classes. In class XI and XII, student must obtain minimum qualifying mark 33% in theory & practical separately in the subjects where ever is applicable. But failing in one subject, will be eligible to appear in supplementary exam in that subject.

4. A student who fails in the Annual Examination may be re-admitted in the next session in the same class. A student who fails twice in class, not be admitted under any circumstance."
5. After the completion of each exam, parent - teacher meet is held to share the strength and weakness of student. If a student does not appear in he/she will be considered as fail except on account of an authentic cause which would be subjected to the discretion of the Principal.
6. Class Nursery to UKG promotion to the next class shall be graded on the basis of aggregate of all the three evaluation (i.e. Term I - 30% + Term II - 30% and Term III - 40%).
7. Student must of minimum qualify marks i.e. 40% for promotion to the next class.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SCHOOL

The school does not hold any responsibility for the loss of books, stationery, money or any valuable things of a student during the time, or on way to school/home. However parents are requested to keep a check over their wards that they should not carry the valuable things to the school.
